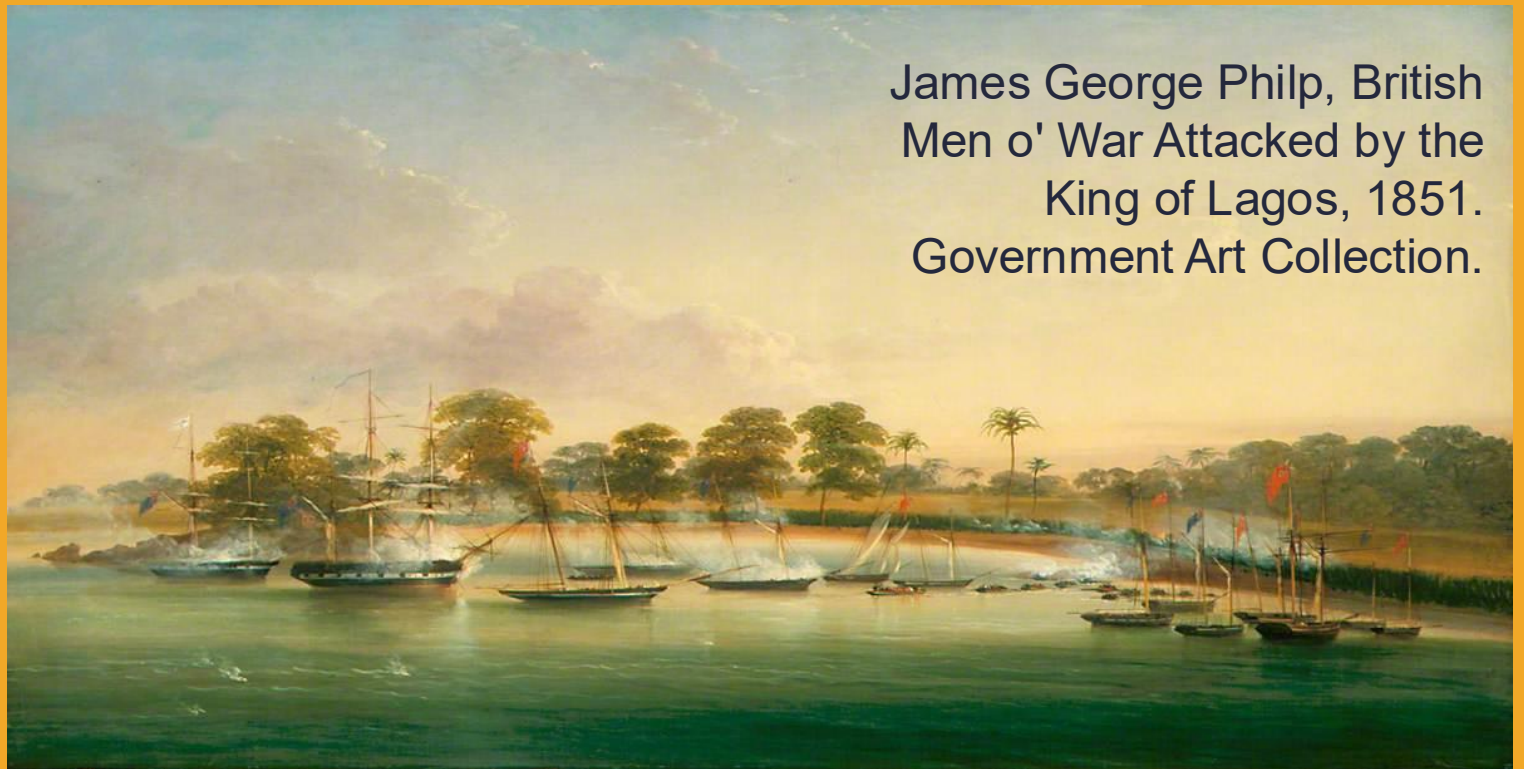

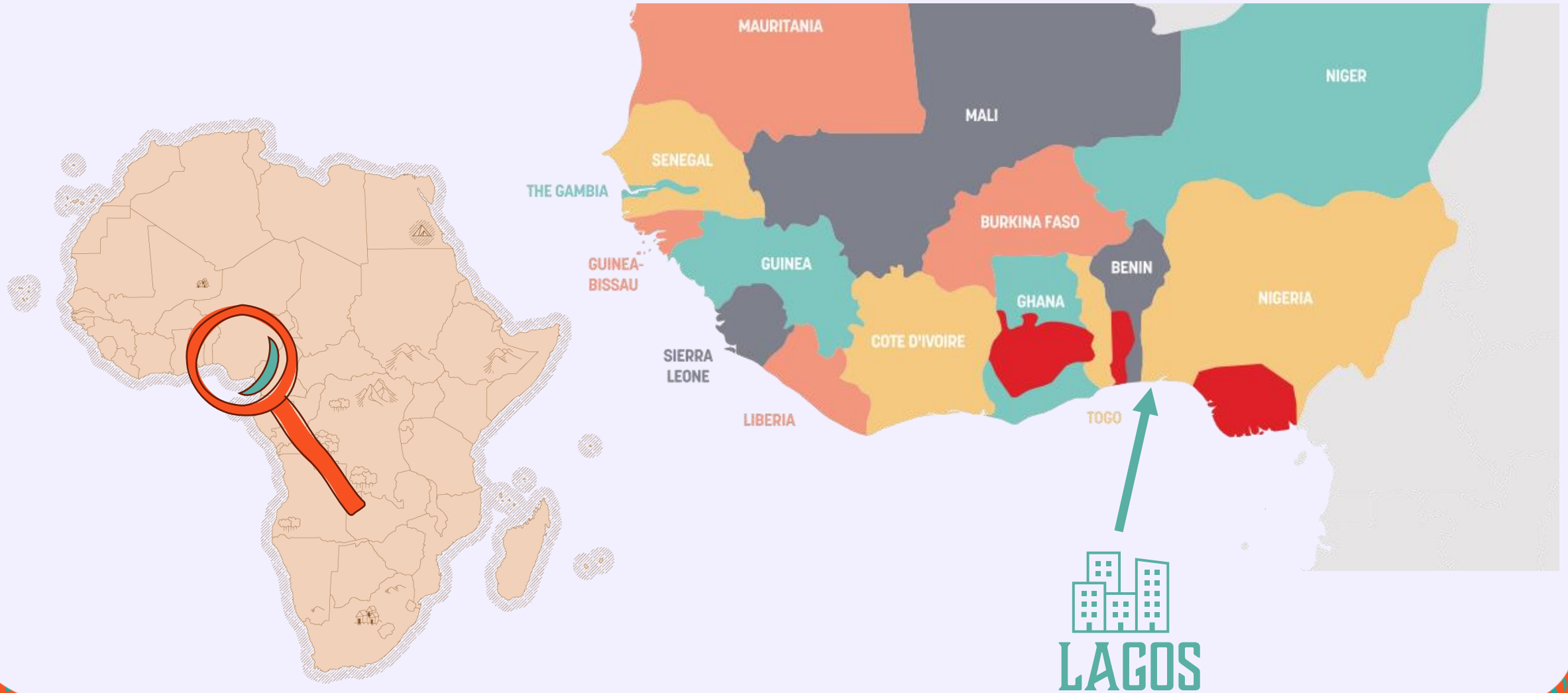

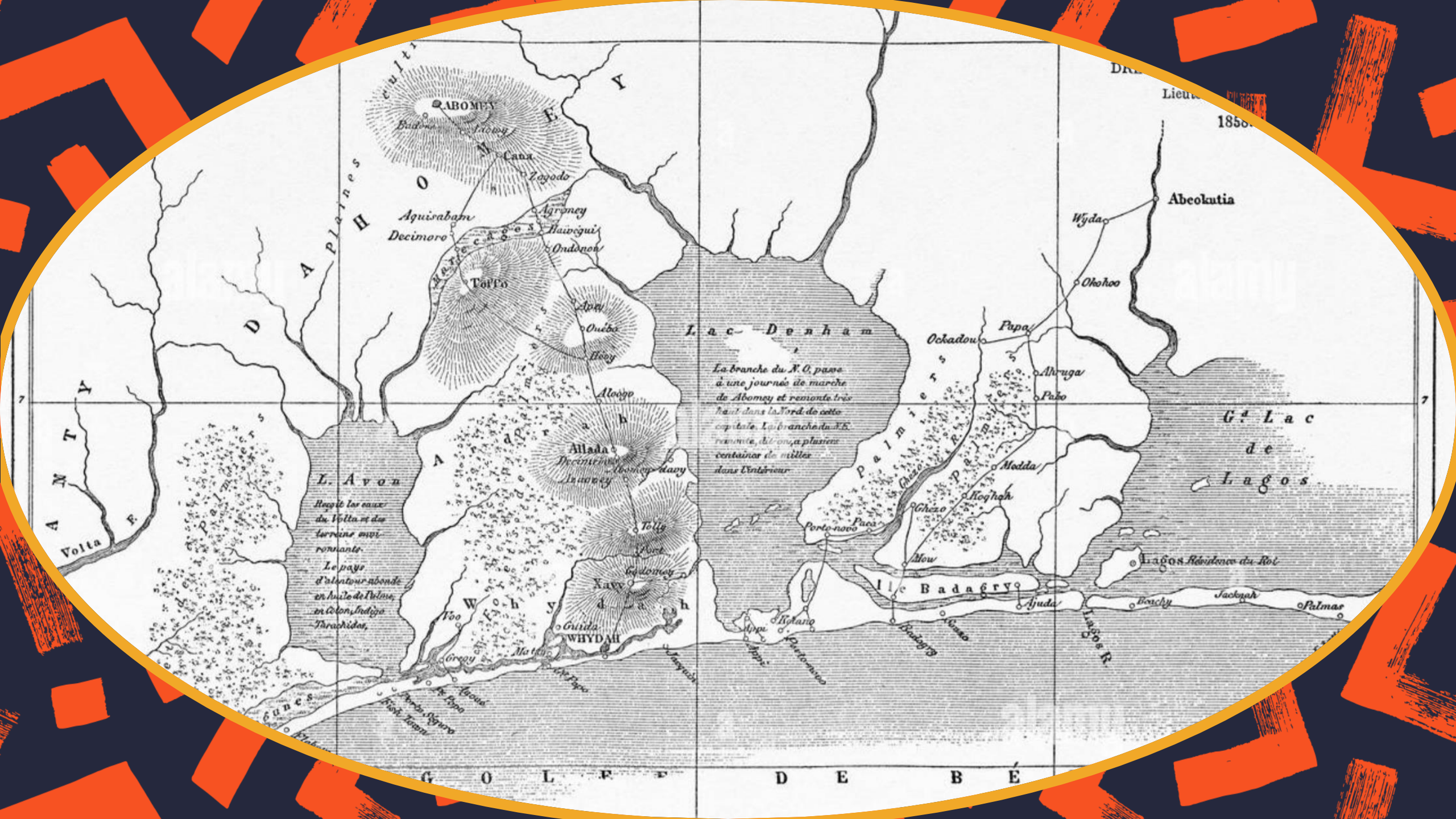

Lagos: A Bit of Context





Introduction

From the River Volta to the Niger Delta there is a coastal lagoon system which linked to interior through rivers. It also served the coastal trading system.

Lagos occupies a central position within the lagoon system between the kingdoms of Allada, and later Dahomey, to the west and the Yoruba kingdom of Ijebu and Kingdom of Benin to the east.



Early History of Lagos

Original inhabitants of Lagos were the **Awori Yoruba** who moved there down the River Ogun Iseri.

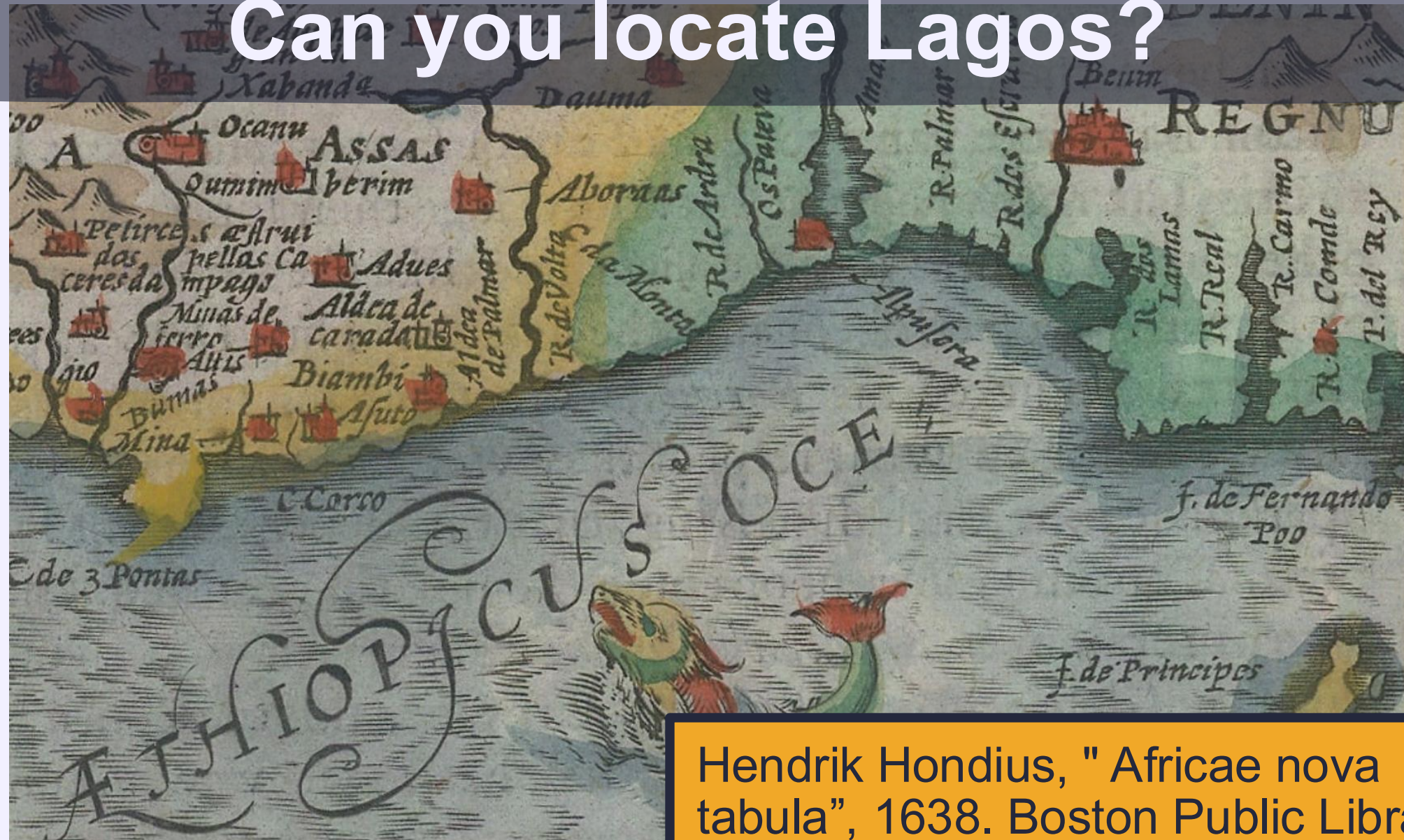
By mid-16th century **Benin** had sent war canoes to establish a military fort in Lagos.

In the late seventeenth century, the present dynasty of **Obas** (Kings) of Lagos was founded.

Still little-known by Europeans.

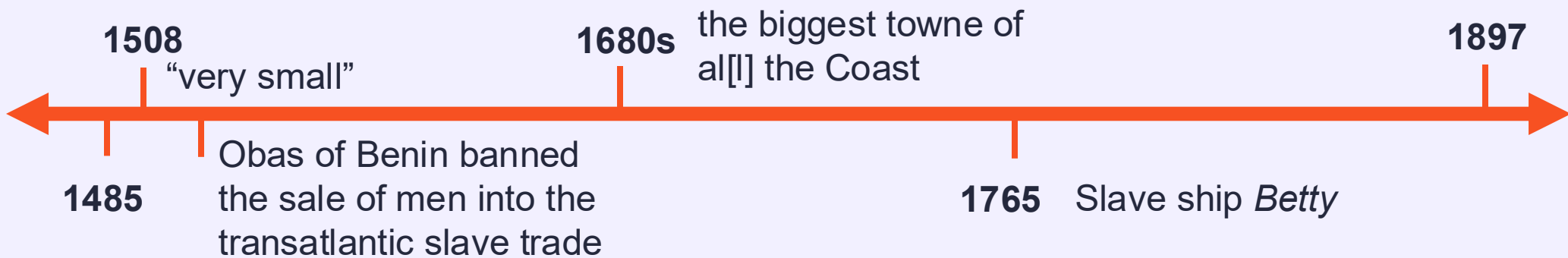

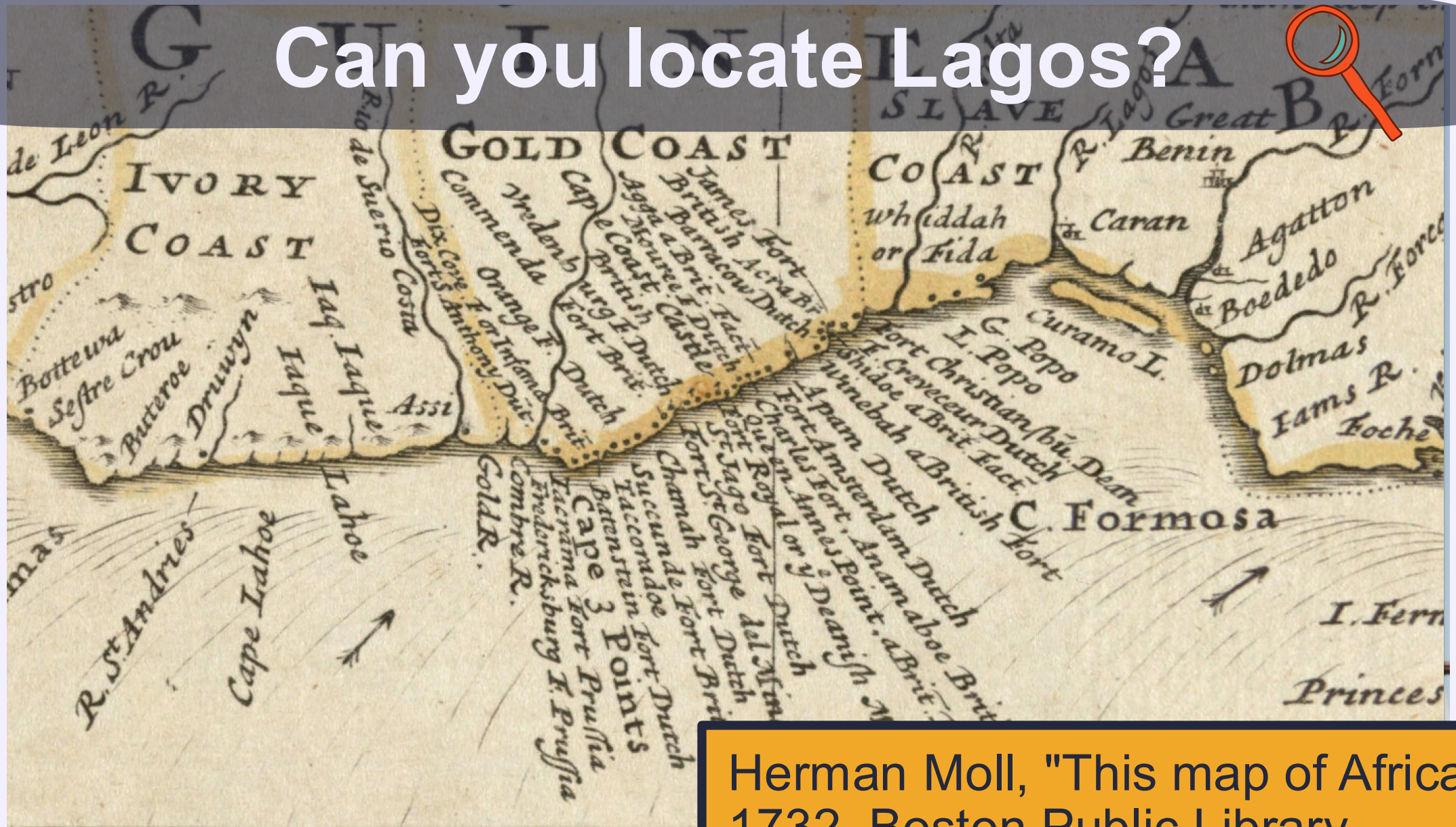

It covers a variety of reasons why Lagos became an important port during the 19th century.

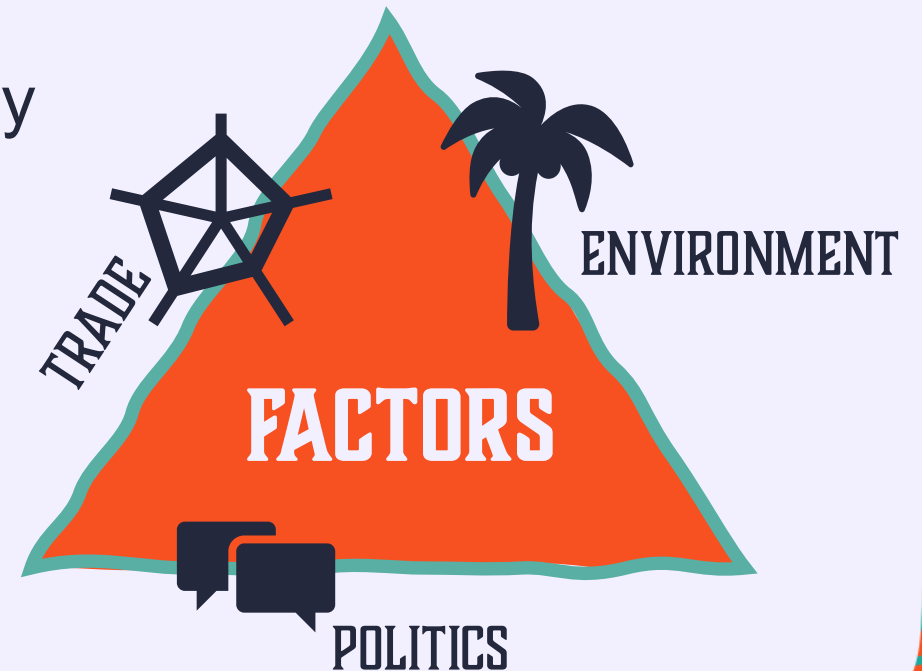
